PROJECT SUMMARY

"30 years of Maastricht: reflections on the past, present and future of Europe" is a project framed in the program CERV, promoted by Molètų Rajono Savivaldybė administracija, as coordinator of the project and in cooperation with 8 partners from 7 different countries of the EU: Lithuania, Portugal, Bulgaria, Spain, Greece, France, Malta and Italy.


